

IMPORTANT NOTICE!

THE FOLLOWING IS A NEW NORTH DAKOTA STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION MEASLES/RUBELLA IMMUNIZATION POLICY WHICH WILL AFFECT ALL STUDENTS ENTERING A STATE-SUPPORTED INSTITUTION BEGINNING THE FALL SEMESTER, 1993. THIS POLICY WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.

NEW POLICY

(PAY PARTICULAR ATTENTION TO PARAGRAPH NUMBER TWO)

1. No student shall be enrolled in any of the institutions under the governance of the North Dakota State Board of Higher Education unless each student can prove immunity against measles, mumps, and rubella. "Enrolled in any of the institution . . ." shall be defined to include students attending regular day classes or evening classes on the campus proper. The policy shall cover students taking one or more courses offered for credit, non-credit, or audit during any of the traditional school terms, including summer.
2. Such immunity can be proven by: (a) presenting evidence of two doses of measles, mumps, and rubella vaccine at least one month apart from a licensed physician or an authorized representative of a state or local health department, (b) presenting proof of a positive serologic test for measles, mumps, and rubella, or (c) presenting proof of date of birth prior to 1957.
3. Exceptions to this policy may be granted only when: (a) immunization is contraindicated by illness, pregnancy, certain allergies, or other medical conditions certified by a licensed physician, (b) the student has had one immunization and agrees to have a second one at least one month later, (c) the student's religious beliefs preclude his/her participation in an immunization program, or (d) the student is attending a workshop or camp.
