

Application for Special Tuition Rate Under Tuition Incentive Program for Dependents and Spouses of Graduates

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North Dakota University System

This incentive program applies to students who are newly enrolled for the Fall 2007 term or later.

Who is eligible?

Students who are dependents or spouses of graduates of any NDUS campus are eligible for this incentive program. A graduate is defined as someone who has earned an associate, baccalaureate, masters, specialist, or doctoral degree. The definition of graduate does not include people who have completed a certificate program. A dependent is defined as someone who was claimed on the most recent federal tax return as a dependent of the graduate.

Which states qualify for the special tuition rate?

Alabama, Arkansas, Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Mississippi, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Vermont, Virginia, West Virginia, and Wisconsin. All other states receive a tuition rate equal to or less than this incentive program and do not need to complete this form.
