Graduation Plan: Bachelor of Arts Degree in Communication (2017-2018 Academic Catalog)

If you are presently under a previous academic catalog, please communicate with the Chairperson of the Department of Fine and Performing Arts regarding your overall academic planning. The Bachelor of Arts in Communication requires a minimum of 8 hours of foreign language study in one or more languages AND at least one minor (or a second major). If you take a preparatory class in math or writing (prefix of ASC), this will impact the planning and completion of your general education, major, and minor requirements. Consult the 2017-2018 academic catalog regarding the specific options for general education requirements. For the overall work of the Communication Major, it is important for you to complete COMM 110, ENGL 110, and ENGL 120 within your first two academic terms.

If you are involved with a varsity sport, you will have to register for a certain number of credits for HPER course numbers during your time at DSU. Please note that certain courses that are required within the major also fulfill certain general education requirements.

To complete the Communication major, a student must earn a "C" grade or higher in all required COMM courses. Be attentive to pre-requisite and co-requisite requirements as you register for courses. It is important that you meet with your assigned advisor before finalizing your registration for each academic term. Please note that if you are in the Theodore Roosevelt Honors Leadership Program, you are required to take different course sections for certain general education requirements. As you transition from a sophomore status to a junior status, you will be required to complete and present an overview of your work to that point (outside of a course setting). Your academic advisor will work with you on this matter. Toward the end of your senior year, you will do this again at an advanced level within the COMM 411 course. Please note that with minors or second majors, credit requirements will vary. The plan below is generalized for most students who study communication. Please consistently consult with your academic advisor.
